

Chapter: the writing of knowledge [93]: narrated Abu Hurayrah radiyAllaahu`anhu:

The Prophet (ﷺ) said "Allah held back the killing from Mecca. (The sub-narrator is in doubt whether the Prophet (2) said "elephant or killing," as the Arabic words standing for these words have great similarity in shape), but He (Allah) let His Apostle and the believers over power the infidels of Mecca. Beware! (Mecca is a sanctuary) Verily! Fighting in Mecca was not permitted for anyone before me nor will it be permitted for anyone after me. It (war) in it was made legal for me for few hours or so on that day. No doubt it is at this moment a sanctuary, it is not allowed to uproot its thorny shrubs or to uproot its trees or to pick up its Luqat (fallen things) except by a person who will look for its owner (announce it publicly). And if somebody is killed, then his closest relative has the right to choose one of the two- the blood money (Diyya) or retaliation having the killer killed. In the meantime a man from Yemen came and said, "O Allah's Messenger (壁)! Get that written for me." The Prophet (壁) ordered his companions to write that for him. Then a man from Quraish said, "Except Al-Idhkhir (a type of grass that has good smell) O Allah's Messenger (2) as we use it in our houses and graves." The Prophet (ﷺ) said, "Except Al-Idhkhir i.e. Al-Idhkhir is allowed to be plucked."

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Chapter: the writing of knowledge

i.e. writing hadith – is something correct and legislated

"Don't write anything from me except the Qur'an" [Muslim 3004]

(i.e. not mix up Qur'an with other statements. Once that risk is not there – then should write hadith).

Good way to preserve hadith

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Protected Makkah from fighting / the elephant:

وَأَرْسَلَ عَلَيْهِمْ طَيْرًا أَبَابِيلَ

And He sent against them birds in flocks,

تَرْمِيهِم بحِجَارَةٍۢ مِّن سِجِّيلُ

Striking them with stones of hard clay,

فَجَعَلَهُمْ كَعَصْفٍ مَّأْكُولٍ

And He made them like eaten straw. [105:3-5]

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From dawn until Asr (on the day of Conquest)

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"...no doubt it is at this moment a sanctuary"

The next day – went back to being a sanctuary

Rulings:

- thorny shrubs (harmful)
- trees
- lost property
- someone who is killed (blood money or executed)

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"a man from Yemen came and said, "O Allah's Messenger (ﷺ)! Get that written for me."

Abu Shaah

- was eager to convey this information
- was concerned he may not remember

The Prophet () asked for this to be written down for him

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al-`Abbas – asked for al-idhkhir (be excepted)

Nice smell

Making buildings (mixed with clay to make it sticky)

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writing hadith – is something correct and legislated



[94]: narrated (`Ubaidullah ibn `Abdullah) ibn `Abbas radiyAllaahu`anhu:

"When the ailment of the Prophet (ﷺ) became worse, he said, 'Bring for me (writing) paper and I will write for you a statement after which you will not go astray.' But `Umar said, 'The Prophet is seriously ill, and we have got Allah's Book with us and that is sufficient for us.' But the companions of the Prophet (ﷺ) differed about this and there was a hue and cry. On that the Prophet (ﷺ) said to them, 'Go away (and leave me alone). It is not right that you should quarrel in front of me.

Thursday – 4 days before the death of the Prophet (ﷺ) on the next Monday (in the morning).

At fajr* on Mon drew curtain – he (ﷺ) saw them praying behind Abu Bakr and he smiled.

Wanted something to write on (shoulder blade)

Was severely ill

"I will write for you a statement after which you will not go astray"

`Umar radiyAllaahu`anhu

- his status
- hadith about milk passed to `Umar
- hadith about shirts was dragging
- e.g. of his correct opinions concerned that the Prophet was v. ill / unwell (other Companions disagreed)

Obligation?

Direction/encouragement?

Book of Allaah

أَوَلَمْ يَكْفِهِمْ أَنَّآ أَنزَلْنَا عَلَيْكَ ٱلْكِتَـٰبَ يُتْلَىٰ عَلَيْهِمْ ۚ

And is it not sufficient for them that We revealed to you the Book [i.e., the Qur'ān] which is recited to them? [29:51]

Differing

'Go away (and leave me alone). It is not right that you should quarrel in front of me.'

Ruling/obligation

Who should authority be given to \rightarrow this was what he (\cong) wanted to indicate

ibn Taymiyyah (Minhaj us Sunnah):

The Messenger of Allah (blessings and peace of Allah be upon him) said to me during his illness: "I was thinking – or I wanted – to send for Abu Bakr and his son and appoint him as my successor, lest people say (that the caliphate should be for So and so) or lest anyone should hope for it for themselves. Then I thought: Allah and the believers would reject anyone who is less qualified than Abu Bakr." Narrated by al-Bukhaari (5342). Also narrated by Muslim (2387) with the words: "when Allah and the believers insist on Abu Bakr."
